Preservation New Jersey, the statewide grassroots historic preservation advocacy and education organization, placed the prominent Riverton riverfront property on their 2007 list of Ten Most Endangered Historic Sites in New Jersey. Until its purchase in 2012, the survival of the home, built circa 1876 for Charles Miller Biddle, the son of a Riverton founder, seemed in serious peril. (for more on the Biddle Mansion and Charles Biddle, see GN issue# 149)

Clad in Pennsylvania green serpentine stone and its first-floor ballroom built with oak from Germany's Black Forest, a 1902 Philadelphia guidebook acknowledged it as the most notable residence in Riverton.

However, steady deterioration since its conversion to multi-family units in 1962 and a 1978 fire that destroyed the grand convex mansard tower caused some to speculate that the once splendid villa would eventually face the wrecking ball.

A cadre of skilled craftspeople and designers continues to restore, rehab, and resuscitate the ailing edifice in order to fulfill Mrs.

Michael and Cathy Spinelli have renovated two important homes in Riverton, their most recent, the former home of Rodman Wharton, a Riverton founder, located at 407 Bank Avenue.

The ten original founders of Riverton hired acclaimed Philadelphia architect Samuel Sloan to layout the village and their villas along the Delaware River. Sloan also designed the Wharton house.

Rodman Wharton was a business partner with his brother, Joseph Wharton; the Wharton School of the University of Pennsylvania and the Wharton State Forest are named in Joseph's honor.





Beatrice and Dr. Michael Horn's recently purchased 107 Lippincott Avenue, most recently, the residence of former Riverton Mayor David Styer, Jr. and his family. Their extensive ongoing renovation has refreshed the Baily and Bassett designed Dutch Colonial that American Suburbs magazine featured in a 1910 article. Riverton founder Ezra Lippincott originally built the home in 1910, for Helen Lippincott, one of his daughters.

The Daniel Campbell Riverton Preservation AWARD

In the fall of 2013, the Society will award its first Riverton Preservation Award honoring an individual, business, or organization making a significant contribution to Riverton historic preservation or by completing substantial improvements to an important building, structure, or site.

We welcome nominations from the community for a building, structure or site worthy of recognition by the historical society with a Riverton Preservation Award.

Daniel Campbell, AIA is a Historic Architect widely recognized for his experience in architecture and historic preservation. Mr. Campbell is also a distinguished past President of the Historical Society of Riverton and editor of the Gaslight News.

After careful and exhaustive research by Society members and the borough led by Daniel Campbell and Betty Hahle the National Register of Historic Places designated The Riverton Historic District, with its 800 acres and 371 buildings, on March 5, 1999. The *National Register of Historic* **Places** is the official list of American historic places worthy of preservation

Mr. Campbell's historical projects include the *Riverton Yacht Club*, Riverton, NJ; Mount Pleasant Mansion and other Fairmount Park houses in Philadelphia, PA; Big House, Andalusia; the Nicholas Biddle Estate, Bucks Co, PA; New Bolton Center, University of Pennsylvania Veterinary School, Kennett Square, PA; Merion Friends Meetinghouse, and other meetinghouses; and the Washington Memorial New Era during the 1930s Chapel, Valley Forge, PA., among other projects. - GERALD WEABER
