

Daniel Campbell, AIA Past President Historical Society of Riverton

Daniel Campbell is a Historic Architect widely recognized for his experience in architecture and historic preservation. Mr. Campbell is also a distinguished past President of the Historical Society of Riverton and editor of the Gaslight News.

The Riverton Historic District, with its 800 acres and 371 buildings, was designated by the *National Register of Historic Places* on March 5, 1999, after careful and exhaustive research by Society members and the borough led by Daniel Campbell and Betty Hahle. The National Register of Historic Places is the official list of American historic places worthy of preservation.

Mr. Campbell's historical projects include the Riverton Yacht Club, Riverton, NJ; Mount Pleasant Mansion and other Fairmount Park houses in Philadelphia, PA; Andalusia, the Nicholas Biddle Estate, Bucks Co, PA; New Bolton Center, University of Pennsylvania Veterinary School, Kennett Square, PA, Merion Friends Meetinghouse, and other meetinghouses; and the Washington Memorial Chapel, Valley Forge, PA., among other projects.

Walter Croft AIA architect and Daniel Campbell, AIA completed the *Riverton Yacht Club* exterior restoration, including period-designed doors, original colors through paint analysis, and restoration of the second floor *Directors Room* to circa 1880 appearance.

Mr. Campbell's Honors and Awards include the NJ State Historic Preservation Project Award 2000 (Riverton Yacht Club Restoration); Burlington County NJ Historic Preservation Award 2000 (Same); Delaware County PA Heritage Commission Preservation Award, 2001 (Nitre Hall); PA State Historic Preservation Award 2006 (Mount Pleasant Structural Stabilization and Re-roofing); Preservation Alliance for Greater Philadelphia Project Award 2006 (Same); Delaware County Heritage Commission Preservation Award 2010 (Haverford Grange Restoration)
