HISTORICAL HIGHLIGHTS

Walt Whitman was born and raised on Long Island. Whitman was a printer and a teacher. He edited papers in Brooklyn and New Orleans until 1855.

He was not very highly regarded as a poet in the 1800's. Many thought his poetry was somewhat x-rated.

Today he is thought of as one of the most influential American Poets of his time.






