## NEW BANK OFFICER

On February 1, Joseph C. Brogan will join the staff of the Cinnaminson Bank and Trust Company, of Riverton, as a senior officer.

Mr. Brogan, who presently resides in Drexel Hill, recently resigned his position as Senior Bank Examiner of the Federal Reserve Bank of Philadelphia to accept the position here. He has been an examiner with Federal Reserve since 1945.

## RIVERTON BUDGET HEARING SLATED

The proposed 1957 Budget of the Borough of Riverton is published in full in this issue of The New Era. A public hearing on the budget will be held in the Borough Office, Riverton Fire House, at 9 p.m. on Thursday, March 7.

The explanatory statement accompanying the budget is as follows:

"Each item of revenue and appropriation has been carefully considered and it is anticipated that the tax rate for local municipal purposes will be \$2.22 for each one hundred dollars of assessable valuations, which is \$.03 higher than the 1956 rate.

"The preparation of this budget is closely integrated with the proposed issuance of the sewage disposal plant bonds planned for early spring, and every consideration has been given to that fact. An appropriation of \$20,000 is included in this budget to reduce the present bond anticipation notes of \$250,000, which will then make it necessary to permanently fund only \$230,000.

"Through careful planning and financing, it is now anticipated that the final bond issue will amount to only \$230,000, compared to the \$340,000 as originally authorized for this purpose. Current operating surplus funds have consistently been applied to this end."

DRIVING AWARD MEETINGS

A series of annual Safe Driving Award Meetings were recently held in recognition of the safe driving records of 389 employees of the Camden District of the New Jersey Bell Telephone Company. R. R. Sterrett, District Plant Manager presided.

The guest speaker on these occasions was Bud G. Krayer, Deputy Highway Safety Education Representative in the New Jersey State Division of Motor Vehicles. Mr. Krayer called attention to the fact that the New Jersey Bell Telephone Company operated one of the largest fleets of motor vehicles in the State and paid tribute to management for the importance of careful training and the establishment of strict Company safe driving regulations. The performance on the road was referred to as the best evidence of the attention that is being given to this phase of the job by both management and employees. It was pointed out that with the ever-increasing number of vehicles crowding the highways today more caution than ever must be exercised by operators of commercial vehicles, in order that the alarming death rate from highway accidents may be controlled. According to Mr. Krayer, at the present highway accident rate, one out of every twelve citizens will be killed or injured during the next ten years. In closing, the speaker congratulated those present on their excellent driving record, but at the same time he emphasized the importance of continually guarding against falling into careless habits that could result in accidents.

The company has for many years stressed courteous safe driving habits of its employees, both on and off the job. The welfare of the general public as well as that of the employees themselves has been continuously emphasized. In addition, the company puts forth every effort to keep its huge fleet of motor vehicles in sound working condition at all times.

As has been the practice for many years the company has been invited to sign a Safe Driving Resolution. This card when signed is posted in the vehicle by the regularly assigned driver. Other drivers are encouraged to carry the card on their person, as a constant reminder of their obligation to the public.

## FREEHOLDER CANDIDATE

Freeholder Albert C. Jones, of Moorestown, formally announced today that he will seek re-election in the Republican Primary Election of April 16th.

Jones, who has the support of County G.O.P. leaders, is the first of more than 10 persons reportedly interested in securing the two Freeholder nominations to publicly declare his plans. The other Freeholder position which will become vacant on December 31st is now held by a Democrat.

The nationally known 51-year-old Civil Engineer, in a statement announcing his candidacy for his seventh three-year term, pledged a continuance of the County's careful fiscal policy and "fair representation to all the people in all the municipalities."

Born on his parents' farm in Lumberton on December 11th, 1905, he was first elected a Freeholder in November 1934, after serving as Junior Engineer for Miami City, Florida, 1925, as Assistant to Ocean County Engineer, 1927 and Senior Draftsman in the New Jersey Highway Department, 1931. He established his Civil Engineering firm in Mount Holly in 1933.

He resigned from the Board in 1942 during his third term to enter the Army during World War II. He was separated as a Major in the Corps of Engineers. Following 44 months in military service, he was again elected to the Board in 1946, 1951 and 1954.

As Freeholder Director in 1936, when he also served as County Engineer at no extra salary, he placed the county on a cash basis for the first time in history.
