Health Education

Public Health Nursing literature scribes to the theory that health subscribes to the theory that health education is concerned with school children alone and not with the general public. Our visiting nurses have found this true in practice. In the years Miss Blair and Miss Cook have been working with the schools in these communities, they have been able to raise the standards in health, cleanliness and diet one hundred per cent in many cases. Their general school routine work is as follows.

At the Sacred Heart Parochial School the nurses assist the school

At the Sacred Heart Parocnial School the nurses assist the school doctor, Doctor Voss, with the regular physical examination. That examination checks each pupil's eyes, nose, throat, ears, chest, feet, height and weight. If there are any defects, the nurses prepare a report which the school gives the children to take home. They visit the school each week to check on the general health. They assisted Dr. Newcomb and his assistant give the pupils the Mantoux test for tuberculosis last spring. At Riverton Grammar School the nurses assist the school doctor, Dr.

Dixon, in giving the pupils the same physical examinations. Miss Blair and Miss Cook also assisted Dr. Newcomb in giving the Mantoux test Newcomb in giving the Mantoux test here. If a pupil requries medical or dental care, they help the pupil and his parents to attend to whatever may be necessary. They also visit the school daily. Then they receive from the principal a list of absences of those who are ill. The nurses visit the homes to learn the nature of the illnesses and what is being done about them. Once a week two groups of four children each are taken to Dr. White for the dental clinic he conducts. This insures a safe trip to and from the clinic.

Cinnaminson

At the Cinnaminson Schools the visiting nurses have practically the same routine—the physical examinations by Doctors Dixon and Brady, the daily visit to the school, check on ill absentees, and last spring they helped Dr. Newcomb give the Mantoux test here, too. Cod liver oil is given daily to the children in both kindergartens. The school doctor kindergartens. The school doctor recommends those who need it. The children take it with gusto. The pupils of each school who need med-ical or dental care are checked. The nurses see that parents are convniced of the need of the care. They are shown how their child will profit by it. Ways and means of getting the work done are suggested. The parents are helped to help their children. When it is proven how one child can be given good health by correcting defects, it is easier for the parents to defects, it is easier for the parents to understand why a younger child should have the necessary medical and dental care. Often this requires the nurses to make several visits to the child's home.

In the past school year, Miss Blair taught classes in home nursing at both Cinnaminson schools. She spent two hours, twice a week at the schools. She and Miss Cook have some to the homes of the children to

shools. She and Miss Cook have gone to the homes of the children to care for their patients and have seen their teachings carried out consciensiously. They are enthusiastic about the medical room provided for their use in the colored school. Mrs. Young, her teachers and the P.T.A. work with Miss Blair and Miss Cook to establish an enviable health record for their solcol.

So through the children Miss Blair and Miss Cook in their nineteen and eighteen years respectively of service to these communities have watched the general public health improve. They have seen bad eyesight corrected, tooth defects corrected through care and diet fresh air, sunlight, cleanlinese provided at home, parelyzed children helped to become useful citizens, a balanced diet served on an attractive table. They have helped inaugurate a program whereby the mothers take their children
