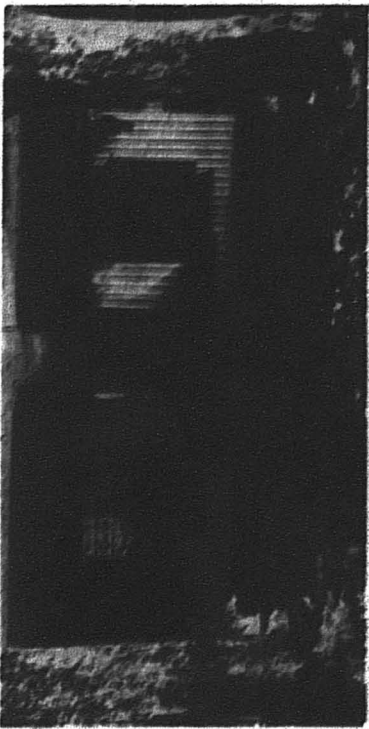

December of this year marks the fortieth anniversary of incorporation of the Riverston Free Library Association.

The library is the outcome of a meeting held in January, 1906, and attended by a number of the representative citizens of Riverston, the purpose being to establish a library in this section. The results were so satisfactory that it was possible to form a permanent organization on February 3 of the same year. Christ Church offered rooms in the Parish House and there the first library was inaugurated.

In the spring of 1908 it became the owner of a library building, at its present location, the structure being the gift of Mrs. Edward H. Ogden as a memorial to her husband.

From a modest beginning, the library has grown to the point where it has many thousands of books on the shelves, while hundreds of readers have cards. Being the only institution of its type in this section, the Riverston Library has a large number of readers from all three communities.

Mrs. Antoinette B. Campbell, who recently retired as librarian, is especially to be commended for the many years of faithful work she has performed in that capacity. To her and her sister, the late Elizabeth Boyd Campbell, who served as librarian for 32 years, can be attributed much of the success and development of the institution. Mrs. Richard Barclay is the present librarian and Elizabeth R. Heister, the assistant.

We, who are interested in the health of our community, can do our share by carrying on our Public Health program and maintaining our high standard of service and education.

Physical and mental well being are essential if the individual is to give his best to his community. In this post-war period with shortages of food, crowded living conditions, industrial unrest and international misunderstanding, nerves are apt to be strained to the breaking point. Therefore, it is very important that we keep physically and mentally well.

In our community we are fortunate to have available two visiting nurses who render service where it is needed. Miss Blair and Miss Cook carry on bedside care in the homes, teach health habits in the schools, check on the health of the school and pre-school children, teach prevention of disease, and endeavor to instruct families in caring for their own.

Dr. C. E. A. Whitlow, of Yale University, at the National Convention for Public Health Nursing held in Atlantic City, stressed the importance of the Private Health Agencies. They are free from political control and have grown to be a great force in the communities throughout this nation.

Both of our nurses attended the National Public Health Convention in Atlantic City in September. We hope they gained inspiration and new ideas from meeting with nurses and Public Health Agents from different sections of the United States.

## NEW INDUSTRY LOCATES HERE

A new industry, the National Canada Company, is now located in Riverston, the firm having recently purchased the Deere property on Fulton street. The existing buildings have been made ready for occupancy and extensive improvements are planned for the entire surroundings. The company has been in operation in Chicago for a number of years and the Riverston plant will be known as the Eastern Division.

The organization imports cases from Argentina and the material is also shipped here from manufacturers in the Middle West. The material is then ground, graded and blended according to its eventual use by manufacturers in a number of industries which include paper, spray rubber, plastics, paper coating and rubber. The finished cases will be shipped to such plants direct from Riverston.

At a later date it is probable that certain cases products will also be made here by the company which expects to employ 30 people.

Local authorities are greatly pleased that the company has located here and expect that it will become one of the main assets of the community.

## LIPPINCOTT FOURTH IN STAR REGATTA

The Riverston Yacht Club represented the "West Jersey" fleet of "Star Class" yachts at the 25th International Regatta held at Havana Cuba this year ending November 30. This Regatta was the first held since the war restrictions were lifted.

Bob (R.L.) Lippincott with his "Blue Star II" and R. Levine as crew was the qualified "fleet" entry. The "Blue Star II" was constructed during the winter of 1943-44 and went through shakedown races on the Delaware River during this last summer.

This boat entered the International races at Havana against 27 other Star Yachts from abroad as well as from U. S. waters.

The races were held in the open ocean waters off the famous Havana Morro Castle and Malecon, at the foot of the Avenida de los Presidentes. The last race of the series was the only one with a calm sea prevailing, and with no break-down.

## MUCH WORK—NO ACTION

Residents in the Delaware section of East Riverston will still have a problem on their hands in the event of high water in the Delaware River. After months of work towards relief, with the aid of Congressman Frank A. Mackenzie, Jr., of Riverston, have been unable to find a Federal agency which will admit responsibility for the condition.

State Senator Arthur W. Lewis and Assemblyman Albert McCoy are now working on the problem to ascertain whether any State organization can find a solution.

One method of keeping the water under control suggested recently was to construct a dike with all the letters and other documents which have been accumulated in connection with the case.

## Teachers Ask Raise

The Board of Education of the Riverston Public School has received the following petition signed by all members of the teaching staff:

"TO THE MEMBERS OF THE BOARD OF EDUCATION: The State of New Jersey, as well as practically every other state in the United States, is acting to adjust teachers' salaries to the rising cost of living.

An adjustment in salary at this time would not really be an increase, since the cost of living has risen and is still rising. The following from the October, 1946, N.E.A. Journal states the problem clearly: "This situation is the result of a chain of circumstances. Teachers' salaries have always been grossly inadequate. There was the fact that teachers' salaries which had been fixed when teachers were not subject to Federal income taxes, were made subject to those taxes. Then came war-time inflation which has been followed by post-war inflation."

Another "blast" sent from F. L. Hips, Executive Secretary of the N. J. Education Association, tells what happened in Morris Plains: "The Board put the question to the people. By 419 to 22 the voters approved \$27,000 additional funds to provide teacher increases of \$410-\$500, retroactive to September 1, 1946."

With the critical financial situation facing us, we the faculty of Riverston School unanimously wish to request that the Board of Education consider granting to all teachers retroactive as of September 1, 1946. The Board, cognizant of the rising cost of living, is in sympathy with higher salaries for teachers, and would like expressions from the citizens of Riverston on the subject. The Board of Education will meet on January 7th for final approval of the 1947-48 budget. Anyone interested is cordially urged to attend this meeting.

## NOTICE

A Proclamation has been issued by the Acting Governor under date of Nov. 25, stating that the Federal Government has requested the cooperation of the State of New Jersey in conserving the existing coal supplies, and that a state of emergency exists. Local Officials are directed to take appropriate action to procure the suspension of all unnecessary use of gas, electricity and coal until further notice.

Applicable to the Borough of Riverston, the following uses of electricity are prohibited or restricted:

Outdoor and indoor advertising and promotional lighting;  
Outdoor display and food lighting except to the extent necessary for the conduct of outdoor business or services;

Outdoor or indoor decorative and ornamental lighting;  
Show window or showcase lighting;

Outdoor or indoor sign lighting, except for directional or identification signs using not more than 60 watts per establishment; also entrance lighting, except the minimum essential for public health and safety—not more than 60 watts per entrance.

Any other form of general outdoor or indoor illumination in or about non-commercial, industrial or other non-residential establishments in excess of 50 per cent of the illumination normally used.

The Police Department of the Borough of Riverston have been instructed to enforce the foregoing provisions, and to report any violations to the Borough Council.

"It is to be hoped, therefore, that motorists heed the advice to keep away from fire scenes. If they can't entirely suppress the yearning to be close-up spectators, they ought to park at least several blocks distant and do their looking as pedestrians."

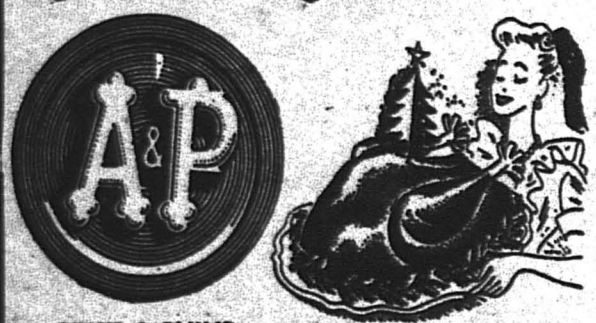

**AN ORDINANCE OF THE BOROUGH OF RIVERTON IN THE COUNTY OF BURLINGTON, STATE OF NEW JERSEY, RELATIVE TO THE REMOVAL OF RUBBISH AND GARBAGE, AND THE PENALTIES THAT MAY BE IMPOSED FOR THE VIOLATION THEREOF, AND REPEALING AN ORDINANCE OF THE SAID BOROUGH ADOPTED NOVEMBER 2, 1934, RELATIVE TO THE REMOVAL OF RUBBISH AND GARBAGE.**

**BE IT ORDAINED** by the Borough Council of the Borough of Riverton in the County of Burlington, State of New Jersey:

**SECTION 1:** That by reason of conditions prevailing in the said Borough of Riverton, including the existence of a large number of frame dwelling-houses and other frame buildings within a relatively small municipal area and the concentration of population within the said Borough, it is hereby found and determined by the governing body of the said Borough that it is necessary and expedient for the preservation of the public health, safety and general welfare, and to eliminate fire hazards, that brush, weeds, dead and dying trees, stumps, rubbish, obnoxious growths, filth, garbage, trash and debris should not be permitted to exist on any lands situate within the said Borough.

**SECTION 2:** That the owner or tenant of any lands in the said Borough on which there now exist or hereafter may exist brush, weeds, dead and dying trees, stumps, roots, obnoxious growths, filth, garbage, trash and debris, or any of them, shall remove the same within ten days next after notice so to do shall have been given to such owner or tenant by the said Borough.

**SECTION 3:** That in the event of the refusal or neglect of any owner or tenant of lands to comply with any notice given as provided for in Section 2 of this Ordinance, the Borough Clerk of the said Borough shall cause the brush, weeds, dead and dying trees, stumps, roots, obnoxious growths, filth, garbage, trash and debris to be removed from the lands referred to in such notice; and shall certify to the governing body of the said Borough the cost of such removal.

**SECTION 4:** That all costs certified to the governing body of the said Borough pursuant to Section 3 of this Ordinance shall be examined by the said governing body, which shall cause a list of the same to be made, and the amount so charged shall forthwith become a lien upon such lands and shall be added to and become and form a part of the taxes next to be assessed and levied upon such lands, and the same shall bear interest at the same rate of taxes and shall be collected and enforced by the same officers and in the same manner as taxes.

**SECTION 5:** That a corporation shall be deemed to be the person within the meaning and operation of this Ordinance.

**SECTION 6:** That any person who shall violate any of the terms or provisions of this Ordinance, or refuse, fail or neglect to do any act or thing thereby required to be done, shall, upon conviction thereof before the Borough Recorder or other magistrate having jurisdiction, forfeit and pay such fine, not exceeding the sum of One Hundred Dollars (\$100.00), as shall be imposed by the Borough Recorder or other magistrate before whom such person shall be convicted, or (if the party so convicted be a natural person) be imprisoned in the Borough Jail or County Jail for such term, not exceeding sixty (60) days, as the Borough Recorder or other magistrate, in his discretion, shall determine; provided, however, that (if the party so convicted be a natural person) the Borough Recorder or other magistrate shall have power, in his discretion, to impose sentence of both fine and imprisonment not exceeding the maximum limits hereinbefore fixed.

**SECTION 7:** That an Ordinance of the said Borough entitled, "An Ordinance for the better protection of life and property from fire by providing for the removal of inflammable or combustible rubbish, weeds, grass and bridges from land in the Borough of Riverton," adopted and approved on the eighth day of November, 1934, being known as Ordinance No. 158 of the said Borough, be and the same is hereby repealed.

**SECTION 8:** That this Ordinance shall take effect immediately upon its final passage and adoption, approval, and publication in the manner prescribed by law.

## Teachers' Salaries In Cinnaminson

A public meeting of the citizens of Cinnaminson Township and the Board of Education will be held at the Westfield Public School on Thursday, January 2, 1947, at 7:30 p.m., at which time the taxpayers will be given the opportunity to express their views in connection with increasing the school budget to take care of teacher salary increases.

A letter to the Board of Education from the teachers reads:

Since the beginning of this school year, boards of education throughout the country have been making adjustments in teachers' salaries to meet the unprecedented rise in the cost of living.

The attention of the nation has been focused on the inadequacy of teachers' salaries through the medium of the press, radio, educational associations and current magazines.

According to the New Jersey Department of Agriculture at Trenton, food prices were 99.4 percent higher in October of this year than in August, 1939. On a weekly basis the average monetary salary of the teachers of Cinnaminson Township, plus their bonus is \$28.77. According to our national economists the purchasing power of the 1946 dollar as compared to that of 1939 is fifty-five cents and is steadily dropping.

At the New Jersey State Teachers' Convention in November, the New Jersey Superintendents of Schools endorsed the idea of a \$2500 minimum salary for all teachers in the state.

As the result of a meeting of the entire faculty of the Cinnaminson Township Schools, we the teachers unanimously request the following:

1. The immediate payment of a cost of living bonus to all teachers.  
2. A \$200 contract increase for all teachers retroactive to September, 1946.

Because of insufficient time we are unable to submit for your consideration a complete salary scale for the school year 1947-48. However we are in unanimous agreement on the following:

1. That the minimum salary in our proposed scale for 1947-48 be \$2,000.  
2. That the Board of Education include in its budget for the next year \$300 per teacher in order to be able to make the necessary adjustments resulting from the proposed salary scale to be submitted to you in the near future.

The taxpayers are urged to attend this meeting as the decision reached will determine the amount to be set up in the school budget for salaries.

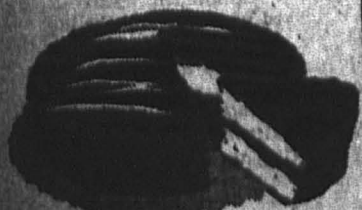

To the Editor:

The question of whether or not to vote teachers' salaries is only part of a problem which Riverton and similar communities may find themselves facing in the not too distant future. In spite of the fact that we now have what can be considered as a very good school, it may seem to be more and more inadequate.

All over the nation there is a growing campaign for the improvement of our school systems. Problems of maintaining schools have changed and will continue to change. In spite of the fact that a great many of us prefer to send our children to a small school, cost per pupil is going to continue to rise as we compete with larger systems to attract and keep good teachers, and to keep abreast of the rising standards of education.

That means that we may have to consider consolidation of our system with those of surrounding communities into a central school. We will lose the advantage of a small school, but it may be the only way we will be able to keep down the cost of maintenance. The initial cost will be unpleasant to swallow, but I truly believe that we will have to make up our minds to it sometime. Now is the time to investigate and to make any necessary plans.

Education is not a privilege for our children, but an absolute prerequisite for a democratic system of government. In the face of that, the percentage of public money spent on education throughout the nation is too small by comparison with appropriations for other government activities.

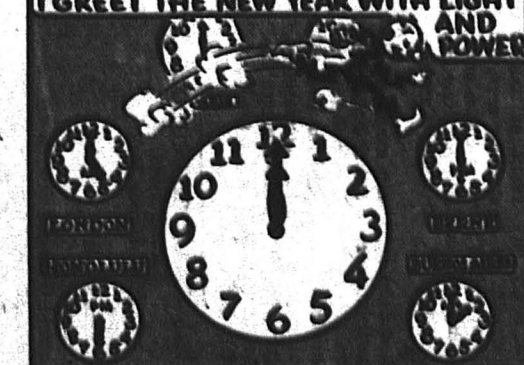
