Assets Administration in Philadelphia, is constantly announcing sales of surplus equipment and materiel. According to that office, optical comprising periscopes, equipment telescopes, binoculars and similar equipment, costing the government \$5,000,000 have been sold during the last five months. \$250,000 worth of fire extinguishers were offered for sale at less than half of their original cost; \$9,000,000 worth of Army and Navy surplus shoes are being offered porting. for sale; enough shaving brushes to lather the faces of two million men will be offered at competitive bidding, closing March 24, 1947. These others announced during just that hort period from February 12, 1947 to February 20th, 1947 by this one

On February 6th the same office announced that five foreign governments have bought more than one million dollars worth of surplus property through it, Russia leading purchases, paying \$292,613 for steel products, industrial machinery and railroad equipment which originally cost \$660,510, which represented a loss of 57 per cent on such equipment as locomotives and car parts, cranes and derricks, wire, ingots and pipe tubing.

For those interested, the same office announced on February 14th that the plant at Burlington which was built and equipped by the government and leased ot the Aluminum Corporation of America for war-time production of aluminum will be put up for sale or rent during March. It is an eight million dollar surplus war plant and another eight million was spent to equip it. There are about 70 acres of land in the prop-erty, which is on Keim Boulevard adjacent to State Highway 25. The awo sections of the plant have thirtyine permanent structures with a combined floor area of about 645,000 square feet. Their floor areas range from 145 to 86,000 feet. In addition there are 15 temporary frame struc- band. tures. Among the equipment are hoists, cranes, items and special electrical facilities. The plant has utilities for water, 13,800 linear feet of trackage.

The following is the 1946 Annual Report of the Burlington County Free Library as submitted by Hazel C. Clark, librarian:

The staff of the Burlington County Library very much enjoy their work with people and books. To find a book that a reader wants and to get it to him gives one a great satisfaction, and to take an armload of new books into a school room filled with children is a most gratifying experience. Meeting people, talking about books, opening boxes of new books and glimpsing the fascinating pages inside, these are the tasks that make up our day, our week, and our year, and make our work so stimulating and enjoyable. But when the record of the years' work is reduced to reports and statistics, it becomes Officers for dull and uninteresting. The human touch is lost and instead we appear to have only the report of a machine doing so much work in a given time.

There are now 111 centers from which books are distributed through the County. Several of the small library statons have been closed during the year and we have been unsuccessful in our efforts to find a new location. It is recommended that a study be made of the method of distributing books to our small communities to make certain if they are now given the best possible service under our present organization.
