Faunce, Sheriff of Burlington county: "It is very odd that such a subject as washing cars at the jail garage should come up at a time like this when it has been the practice for years-long before I was Sheriff of Burlington county. The odd part of it is that the water at the garage (which is used for washing cars) does not come through the jail meter but is connected with the county but is connected with the county clerk's office, which had a very low water rent for the quarter. Regulating Excavations in County Roads or Streets in the County of Burlington and Providing Penalties for the Violation Thereof.

Be it resolved by the Board of Chosen Freeholders of the County of Burlington, as follows:



Only eight other states so limit the Govenor's veto. In 34 of the states, it takes a two-thirds vote to over-ride a veto, and in five states it can be done by a three-fifths vote of members of the legislature.
