We can now appraise the work of this session. In doing so, remember that the great accomplishments were made under most difficult circumstances. It was the first time in many years the Republicans have had control. They had to organize their own Party. Then they had to reorganize the whole Congress under the Reorganization Act passed in 1946. The opposing Party was in the White House and in all the innumerable bureaus and offices of the Executive Department, which makes up by far the greatest part of the Federal government. Twice the President vetoed it. Twice we almost passed it over his veto. The second time the House succeeded, but the Senate did not. The blame rests squarely upon the President. He is sold on the New Deal spending philosophy.

TRAFFIC DEATHS DROP

Traffic accident fatalities in New Jersey at the end of the first six months were 17 per cent below the deaths in the corresponding months of last year, Motor Vehicle Commis-sioner Arthur W. Magee reported recently.

This year's total was 285 as against

342 last year, a saving of 57 lives. While highly pleased with the impressive improvement, Commissioner Magee cautioned that there has been no perceptible change in the leading causes of accidents. He urged that motorists take notice of these leading causes which he said were:

Violated right of way (of motorist and pedestrian) Following too closely. On wrong side of road. Speeding. Improper training.

REQUEST BY LEWIS

Senator Arthur W. Lewis has in-vited the people of Burlington Coun-ty to review the comprehensive report of the constitutional convention's legislative committee, of which he is vice chairman, and to submit any proposals for amendments by Monday, August 11th. The convention will probably meet at New Brunswick on that day to receive amendments.

Debate on the various committee reports is contemplated to begin Wednesday, Senator Lewis added, with the tentative order as follows: executive, legislative, judicial, Bill of Rights and taxation, The Senator indicated he will report to the people of Burlington County on important phases of other reports from time to time.

"I am anxious that every resident of the County shall know exactly what is being done in New Bruns-wick," he said. "Further, I want all cisms or suggestions to their delegates. Proposed amendments should be forwarded at once, for they are to be submitted at the convention next Monday."

Senator Lewis said that he heartily approves the plan advanced to streamline the function of the Legislature and increase the efficiency of its operations.

"We are recommending more op-portunity for study of bills before they are acted upon," he pointed out. We are acting to strengthen home rules for counties and municipalities and minimize mandatory legislation. It should be possible for a majority of legislators to bring about a spe cial session, instead of the sole authority for the call resting with the executive.

"It is agreed almost without ex-ception, I think, that the terms and compensation set up for legislators in an earlier century are inadequate today. We are recommending fouryear terms for Senators and twoyear terms for Assemblymen, to be elected between National elections. We urge that the question of salary be left to legislative enactment rather than constitutional mandate.

"The present prohibition against members of the Legislature accepting appointments while members, would be broadened to bar such appointments during the term for which they were elected. Appointive power of the Legislature to executive and administrative offices would

"Our recommendations to Legislature for consideration of bills on subjects which we feel should not be made part of the constitution include regulation and curtailment of lobbying, and provision for periodic revision of the statutory law.

Senator Lewis said he will issue a public statement on other sections of the committee report, including the controversial gambling question, after he has completed a study he now is making into all phases of this subject.

SQUASH, says Webster's dictionary, is the act of crushing some substance to a pulp, the sudden fall of a soft body, a game played with a racket and ball, or a large yellow ruit growing on a vine.

Summer squash, a vitamin and mineral filled vegetable, native to the gourd family, comes in 77 varieties and 14 different types. A cook with an eye for squash can select from this array any color, size size from a few ounces to over a hundred pounds for the kind used in canning; colors range from white to orange and in shape they run growths with twisted necks. According to the A & P Service

for Home-Makers, the summer type, technically known as Zucchini, is excellent when fried, boiled and covered with a tasty sauce, or baked Italian-style and served with a garnish of tomatoes and grated cheese. The crooknecked or vegetable marrow type of squash is most welcome at the table when mashed, and its delicate flavor is given an seasoning.

Winter squash, as a rule, is larger

in size and firmer in flesh. It is serviceable all through the winter and, if taken before the frost has touched it, will keep well in a warm dry place. Its food value is also high it contains many carbohydrates and a large percentage of protein. It is from this branch of the squash family that we receive the filling for our delicious pies.

To add an extra touch of flavor to a delicious Sunday dinner, try baked yellow squash with roast beef, green beans, sweet corn on the cob, a crisp vegetable salad, and for dessert, chilled watermelon slices and a beverage.

Plan Wiring System For Adequacy With Future Requirements in Mind

According to the recently issued Handbook of Farmsteed Wiring Design, a properly wired farmstead



must (1) have a service entrance of pliances and equipment.

Planning a farm wiring system which will meet requirements necessary for the efficient and economical operation of electrical production equipment today—and tomorrow—should not be difficult provided certain basic principles are followed.

The first two requirements depend on careful planning, with a view to future as well as present needs. The wiring system should be installed by a person familiar with electric power and light problems on farms and qualified to do a first-rate wiring job. The third requirement will be satis-The third requirement will be satisfied if the wiring system is installed in compliance with the National Elec-

Designing a farmstead wiring system with an eye on future electrical requirements is highly important. It is more economical to install wiring for maximum needs at the outset than to spend additional money for re-wiring when more equipment is added, and larger wires and more outlets are required. Because an elecrifled farm depends so much on electric power to operate motors and appliances, as well as lights, it is vital that wires be large enough to deliver

the necessary amount of current.

Electricity, traveling along wires, can be likened to a load of hay being driven along a hedge-lined lane. The bigger the load and the narrower the lane, the more hay is lost along the hedge rows. So it is with electricity. Wires, which are too small to carry the amount of electricity required, will prevent sufficient power from reaching the electrical equipment, thus reducing its efficiency by as much as 25 percent and more. It is also wise economy to plan for plenty of

SUNDAY DINNER -Suggestions.

TURKEY, once enjoyed only at Thanksgiving and Christmas. has now won a year-round place on the nation's dinner table. There is no longer any season of the year when the birds are unavailable, both Toms and hens being found in good supply at the present time, reasonably priced.

As American as baseball, turkeys were running wild when the Pilgrims arrived on these shores. They became a feature of the first Thanksgiving dinner and have since

According to the A & P Service for Home-Makers, the present day turkey, much improved by generations of scientific breeding, rates among the seven basic foods because of its nutritive value. When selecting a turkey, judge the size by the number of people

to be served, figuring on a pound tor each person per meal. There is only a slight difference in taste between Tom and hen tur-

keys, most people favoring the Tom. There is, however, a big difference in weight, Toms usually tipping the scales at better than 15 pounds, while hens run from 8 to 15 pounds. When roasting a gobbler weigh

ing 14 pounds or less, take about three and one half hours to do the job, at an oven heat of 325 degrees. Most people roast a turkey, but this is by no means the only way to prepare it. Old gobblers are best when braised, and young birds are delicious if broiled or panned like chicken. The meat of the turkey is delicious when used in salads and when sliced cold it rates at the top of the list as a mainstay for hotweather meals.

Roast stuffed turkey, mashed po-tatoes, fresh sweet corn on the cob and lima beans topped off by a fresh fruit dessert and a beverage, make an excellent Sunday dinner.


