Take notice that the undersigned, Borough Clerk of the Borough of Riverton, by and with the advice and order of the Borough Council, does hereby prohibit the running at large of all dogs on the streets, highways, roads or other public places in the Borough of Riverton between April 1 and October 1, 1949.
