### PARRY PASTOR TO BE COLLEGE PRESIDENT

The Rev. Reinhold Riemer Elected Head of Moravian Seminary at Bethlehem

The Rev. Reinhold Riemer, for the past four years pastor of the First Moravian Churca at Parry, has been elected president of the Moravian Seminary and College for Women at Bethlehem, Pa., one of the

has been elected president of the Moravian Seminary and College for Women at Bethlehem. Pa., one of the oldest and best known institutions of its kind in the country.

The Rev. Mr. Riemer is the youngest man ever chosen head of the institution, being just past 33. He has been very popular and successful in his pastorate at Parry and the congratulations he has been receiving from his host of friends have been tinged with regret at losing him.

The appointment came to Mr. Riemer as quite a surprise. The acting president of the college, Prof. Edgar T. Shieds, called upon him two weeks ago, but it was not until the Bishop came to see him later that he knew what was in prospect. He accepted the offer of the position Tuesday afternoon,

Mr. Riemer attended the Moravian College and Theological Seminary at Bethlehem and graduated in 1912 with the degrees of B. A. and B. D. He then returned to his home in the Canadian Northwest, where his parents live, and accepted the pastorate at New Sarepta, near Edmonton, Alberta. This is one of the farthest outlying frontier posts of the Moravian Church. In addition to being pastor, Mr. Riemer was postmaster and drove the mail stage on a fifteen-mile trip twice weekly.

In 1915 Mr. Riemer attended the Yale School of Divinity, obtaining the degree of B. D., there and also taking up philosophy and education in the graduate school, He continued his work in the graduate school two years, completing the course required for the M. A., with the exception of his thesis which must be completed; afterwards. His thesis has been somewhat delayed by the strenuous efforts he put into war work and his local pastorate.

During the war the Rev. Mr. Riemer spent one year as executive scereiary of the Home Service Section of the County Red Cross under the chairmanship of William H. Cook, of Palmyra, and succeeded Mr. Cook as chairman the following year.

One of the features of Mr. Riemer's work at Parry during the past two years has been the development of a program of weekday religious education in

ganized all the boys of the community.

Mr. Riemer expects to assume his new duties on May 1.

The young college president's wife, whose abilities were considered by the trustees when they selected Dr. Riemer, is not yet thirty.

"But," said Mr. Riemer, "she will uncofficially play a most important part in reorganizing the household department of the seminary. She will supervise the social life of the students and will direct all changes yoking toward a modernization of the seminary family."

When Vapor is Dry.

There seems to be a popular misconception in the supposition that aqueous vapor and ice are wet. They are in themselves dry, so it has been pointed out by competent investigators, and become wet only when they turn to water. So dry is aqueous vapor, it seems, that it will dry any moist object with which it comes in contact. Superheated steam, before it condenses, is a dry gas. Ice feels wet if the temperature of the hand is sufficient to melt it; as ice it is dry. Another misconception is that the air can be either dry or moist. It is condensed aqueous vapor in the air that is moist, and it would be moist if there were no air. A given quantity of aqueous vapor confined in a given space will be wet or dry, according to the temperature. At 32 degrees, for instance, it might be partially condensed, and consequently wet, while at 70 degrees, owing to expansion, it would be dry.
